


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
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
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A Life of Praise

e live in a technological age where advances are speeding up exponentially. In days gone by (about 10 years ago) I would simply push the car down an incline, pop the clutch and smile as it sputtered to life. Not so any more! It had to get taken in to a "specialist" (see huge dollar signs) to have its software upgraded an so to eliminate the "bug" or "virus", then have the computer rebooted and now when I turn the key (a weird description for an oblong piece of plastic that doesn't look like a key at all) the car starts.

I am leaning towards descriptions of my car experiences since our modes of transport have seen massive changes and advances over time, and it seems to have increased in advances since we entered the techno-age. Guido da Vigevano in invented a windmill type drive-to-gears-towheels car in 1335. Around 400 years later 1712 Thomas Newcomen invented the steam engine; Etienne Lenoir patented the first practical gas engine in Paris in 1860; In 1885 Gottllieb Daimler built a wooden motorcycle that used an Otto combustible engine. By February 1893 the car built by Charles and Frank Duryea was the first gasoline-powered car in America; Henry Ford had an engine running by 1893 but it was 1896 before he built his first car. Since then developments happened at an increased speed, and with the introduction of motor races many new technologies have been included into production cars such as ESP, ABS, powersteering and more.


The Wright brothers made history in 1903 with their first flight and today we have aeroplanes such as the A380 carrying 853 passengers at one time! We have nuclear submarines, space shuttles, hot-air balloons, bicycles and all other modes of transport to carry us from place to place.

LIVING IN THE REALM OF

THE SUPERNATURAL

In the beginning, man's spirit was the dominant force in the world. When he sinned, his mind became dominant. Sin dethroned the spirit and crowned the intellect. But grace is restoring the spirit to its place of dominion. When man comes to realize this, he will live in the realm of the supernatural without effort." (John G. Lake, *The Power of the Name*.)

Can you imagine living in the realm of the supernatural without effort? It's not as far off as you might think. According to the Word of God, at the point of our salvation we are born of the Spirit (John 3:5) and have received the Holy Spirit as our gift from God. Acts 2:38 says, "Repent, and each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit".

Then Galatians 5:25 says, "If we live by the Spirit, let us also walk by the Spirit". This is what John G. Lake was referring to when he said we can have our spirits dominate our lives. The problem comes with the battle of wills between our flesh, the carnal nature, which is governed by our natural, human reasoning; and our re-born spirit nature, which is governed by God's Spirit living in us. Whichever one we give attention to dominates our lives with pretty significant results. John 6:63 says, "It is the Spirit who gives life; the flesh profits nothing".

Having said that, we can start rejoicing right now because Jesus dealt with the sin issue on the cross and broke its power over us! That means we are free to walk and live by the Spirit of God and have the grace to not live according to the flesh and all it dictates! So, to live in the realm of the supernatural, we make walking in the Spirit our conscious decision each day!

Romans 8:4-8 says, "...live and move not in the ways of the flesh but in the ways of the Spirit [our lives governed not by the standards and according to the dictates of the flesh, but controlled by the Holy Spirit]. For those who are according to the flesh and are controlled by its unholy desires set their minds on and pursue those things which gratify the flesh, but those who are according to the Spirit and are controlled by the desires of the Spirit set their minds on and seek those things which gratify the [Holy] Spirit. Now the mind of the flesh [which is sense and reason without the Holy Spirit] is death [death that comprises all the miseries arising from sin, both here and hereafter]. But the mind of the [Holy] Spirit is life and [soul] peace [both now and forever]. [That is] because the mind of the flesh [with its carnal thoughts and purposes] is hostile to God, for it does not submit itself to God's Law; indeed it cannot. So then those who are living the life of the flesh [catering to the appetites and impulses of their carnal nature] cannot please or satisfy God, or be acceptable to Him."

The Word couldn't be plainer. For the victorious child of God, who desires to live in the realm of the supernatural, a lifestyle of sin is out and a life controlled by the Holy Spirit is in! The question is: how do

we do this?

Well, if you look back at verse 6, it specifically speaks about the mind of the flesh and the mind of the Holy Spirit. This tells us there are two very distinct ways of thinking and reasoning in this life; both have rather drastic results. Thinking and reasoning without the influence of the Holy Spirit leads to sin, which always progresses to misery and death; while thinking under the influence of the Holy Spirit progresses to life and peace that lasts for eternity.

OK, so now that we understand that correct thinking is the way to live controlled by the Holy Spirit, the next question is: how do we correct our wrong way of thinking and keep it under the influence of the Holy Spirit?

Here are four simple steps to having victory over our thoughts, where they are dominated by the influence of the Holy Spirit and not our flesh.


1: Fill Up!

Fill your mind with the Word of God. God's Word is full of His thoughts, so the more time we invest in it, the more it will significantly influence our way of thinking. This process of influence is called renewing our minds. Romans 12:1-2 says that it's something we are expected to do as children of God.

Now here's the beauty of this truth: whatever we give our attention to become our desire; and our desires pave the way for our destinies. Did you know that whatever your heart is engaged in, attaches you to it and it becomes your destiny? Matthew 6:21 says, "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." Your treasure is something you regard as being highly valuable. It's something you're passionate about; that one thing that makes you feel the most alive and you simply can't imagine being without. When we fill our minds with God's Word, by the Holy Spirit enlightening it to us, we soon discover that it is alive and full of glorious treasures and we just can't get enough of it! That's why Colossians 3:16 says, "Let the word have its home [in your hearts and minds] and dwell in you in [all its] richness..." Trust the Holy Spirit to lead and teach you as you delight in God's Word and fill your mind with it.

2: Recognise!

Recognise where your thoughts come from. When the Word of God has become our desire and delight, and we are constantly feeding our hearts and minds on it, we will recognise the origin of every thought that enters our minds. You see all thoughts are either faith-based or fear-based. Since God's Word produces faith, peace and life, any thought that is contrary to that will stick out like a sore thumb in your mind. Even if it sounds right or reasonable, its nature will be opposite to what you have been renewing your mind to. The

Too often, we decide to wait for our fears to subside before we will do what God is asking us to do. Unfortunately, our fears may never subside—so instead of waiting, we need to learn how to be courageous.

My husband, Dave, defines courage as the willingness to risk who you are and what you have for what you want and who you want to be. It's a definition that has helped me face my fears to become the person I am today.


Sometimes you have to press in to an attitude of praise and thanksgiving. And it takes a lot of faith and patience, but you can trust that God has your future in His hands.

HANDING OVER

If you have built up a ministry and God has told you to hand over to a younger man, it is only by His grace that we can do it, it is not a natural thing for us to do. When your son or daughter comes of age and you have to release them, it can be quite traumatic and painful at times. If you have a daughter that you really love, sir, and a young man comes into her life (and he will never be good enough for her because there is nobody alive who is good enough for your daughter), you have to release her into his life. After the wedding day she will no longer be primarily your daughter, she will be someone else's wife and then secondly, she will be your daughter. It can be quite a traumatic time requiring a completely different mindset, it is what we have been praying and asking God for, but it can be quite tough when it happens.

I think of a man with some seed in his outstretched hand. A wild bird comes, he admires the bird and keeps his hand flat and the bird flies away and invariably will bring back some of its friends. However, if he tries to contain and possess that bird, when he closes his hand on it, it will eventually die and he will end up with nothing.

Many times I have seen farmers who have sons but will never quite release the farm into their son's hands. After a season, the sons become frustrated and they leave and go overseas to make their own way. The farmer later gets too old and too tired to farm properly and the farm starts to implode and fall apart and eventually in desperation he sells the farm and moves into town. If only he had given his sons a chance when the time was right and let them take over, and burn their fingers and make mistakes (we always have to 'pay school fees' when we learn), the farmer might then still be on the farm, enjoying the farm and his sons.

There is such a fine line because handing over is only half the task; the other half is to receive. It is like the proverbial Olympic relay runner, once he has run his race he has to pass the baton on to the next man so that he can finish the race. That changeover is absolutely critical, that is why they practice it so much because if he drops the baton, then he is out.

The blueprint that I love so much and one which I am endeavouring to apply in my own life, is the blueprint of Jesus himself. The Master called twelve men to be His disciples, not twelve famous heroes or men of stature, but twelve ordinary men. These men walked with the Lord and watched Him for a season. The Lord then walked with them for a season and then He left them on their own. He said in His word that it was expedient for them that He leave and go back to His Father so that they could carry on the work. There comes a time in a man's life when you can't actually teach him anymore and you have to release him. That is where prayer plays such a very important role, you trust God that he will carry on the momentum or legacy or whatever it might be, whether it is family, work or ministry, we have to hand over so that it can grow. Jesus knew that as long as he was on earth, the disciples would not fulfil their own mandate but when the Lord went home to be with His Father then the disciples where imbued from on high with the power of the Holy Spirit and they proceeded to turn the world upside down.

I can really relate to this in terms of the Mighty Men phenomena



that has swept through our land. In 2010 I felt the Lord lay very strongly on my heart that I needed to make MMC 2010 the last one at Shalom. This decision was extremely hard because it was succeeding so well and we had literally started from a vision. Yet, by me saying that 2010 was going to be the last one and telling the men on the final day that they needed to go out and do likewise, we have seen what has happened. This year I have had the privilege of attending no less than three Mighty Men Conferences in the Western Cape, Limpopo and in the heart of the Karoo. There are also many other meetings that have been taking place throughout the country and overseas and that is only because we handed over and God honoured that.

What I want to really stress and I have experienced this in my own life, is that every time you hand something over to God, He gives you something back. You don't do it for that reason, you hand it over in obedience because He has told you to, but He never leaves you empty handed, He always gives you something back and it is usually twice as big as what you gave away. I am busier now than I ever was when I was doing the MMC. God has opened huge doors for me through the media, through television programs, through Facebook, through writing columns and through movies that are being made. I am more excited now than I have ever been in my life!

Don't be afraid to hand over, don't hand over too soon and don't hand over too late. Spend time with God and He will show you the exact time when you need to hand over. When you hand over there must be no strings attached. When I handed over the farms to our boys and the church to a spiritual son of mine there were no strings attached. They could do anything they liked with the farms or the ministry. They have taken them to the next level, the farms are exploding, the ministry is going very well and I have more work to do now than I have ever had in my entire life. That is because of God's goodness. He says in Matthew 6:33, 'Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these other things will be added unto you'. May God bless you as you continue to be obedient to the call that He has put on your life.











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THOUGHTS ON SHARING **THE GOSPEL**

e have this great commission from Christ to go into the whole world and share the Gospel. Before we can respond to the commission, we have to respond to Christ Himself, since the commission will just be another job if not motivated by a personal relationship. This simply means that if we even attempt to abide by the instructions of the commission without first having a personal experience with the giver of the commission we have already failed. We can storm the streets with tracts and Bibles, stand on corners with bullhorns and speak about Jesus, compare the numbers of "souls saved" from the records we keep, and remain ineffective in connecting those very same people on the street with the love of God. The commission without Jesus is just another task to be done, and ultimately devoid of power.

The word "gospel" is taken from the Old English word godspel, which is made up of the word god (good) and spel (story, message); literally it means "good message" which is sometimes translated in moderns English as "good news." Essentially the gospel is good news and not doctrine; it is not a set of rules, a behaviour thermometer, or an attitude gauge... it simply is good news. Jesus defined the message of good news rather simply - it is to show people that there is freedom to be truly loved, truly valued, and truly estimated in a relationship with God. The good news is simply to show people that they can be free from fear, disappointment, rejection, sickness, and worthlessness by accepting the love and grace from a Father burning to give these away as a free gift. The good news in essence is simply a call to be loved and to love in return.

Once the good news has been tasted it sparks a response in us to serve it to others as a gourmet meal. We have an option here in the way in which to share this. Firstly, we can open the recipe book and read to others the precise ingredients to use, the exact measurements of the ingredients, the ideal temperature of the stove, the time it will take to prepare, the garnishes to complete the meal, and even show them a photograph of the finished

product. Alternatively, we can present people with the finished product, let them taste it first and as a bonus send them away with the detailed recipe so they can continue to make the same meal for sharing with others. I can guarantee you that the people most impacted by our interaction with them would be the ones who tasted the food first.

It would be silly to deny that Jesus called us to spread the gospel. So, we don't. But it is up to us how effective we will be in fulfilling the commission successfully. I can think of no better way that to look at the example of Jesus on how to "do" this commission - after all, Jesus was simply asking us to do what we have already seen Him doing.

Jesus offered Himself as the 'meal of all meals' and the 'dish above all other.' And I mean no disrespect by this analogy. It was Jesus who said He is the 'Bread of Life' (already proclaimed in the Holy Place in the temple), and it was He who offered His disciples His blood to drink. Since He was the ultimate sacrifice, obviously we cannot offer the same. However, we are called to offer ourselves to Christ, forsaking even our very lives. In this way, we too can offer others what Christ had first offered us. No greater love has man than to lay down his life for others. And so, we need to offer up our very life to 'do' as Christ 'did.' We then share His suffering, and in so doing, share His love.

To 'do' the commission of Christ will require everything from us, and it will require us to be nothing in ourselves so that we can be everything in Christ. In essence, the good news we bring is totally dependent on us obeying Christ until death. And in our death Christ is glorified, and this is the good news.

Today, many people are not willing to pay that price, and so the good news becomes watered down, a meal prepared with sub-standard ingredients, and shortcuts taken in the preparation. It is time that we dust off the original recipe and start afresh, take what is required and offer others the meal of meals!



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THE OTHER SIDE OF

while the mainstream media always seems to focus on books that conservatives (particularly parents) want out of their children's schools, the truth is, the Left is pretty active in attempting to censor books as well.

For instance:

- "Huckleberry Finn" by Mark Twain: This classic novel, published in 1884, has faced criticism from some progressives due to its use of racial slurs and its portrayal of racial dynamics in the United States.
- "To Kill a Mockingbird" by Harper Lee: While widely considered a literary classic, this novel has faced objections from some progressives due to its portrayal of racial themes and the use of racial slurs.
- "The Catcher in the Rye" by J.D. Salinger: This influential novel has faced criticism from some progressives who argue that it promotes antisocial behavior and undermines traditional values.
- "Harry Potter" series by J.K. Rowling: While immensely popular, this series has faced objections from some progressives due to concerns about its portrayal of certain themes, such as gender and diversity.
- "The Bell Curve" by Richard J. Herrnstein and Charles Murray: This book, published in 1994, sparked controversy for its analysis of intelligence and its implications for social policy. Some on the Left have criticized the book as promoting scientific racism.

- "Gone with the Wind" by Margaret Mitchell: While published in 1936, this classic novel has faced criticism and calls for banning from some on the Left due to its portrayal of slavery and its romanticized depiction of the Antebellum South.

We've also seen a rise in Amazon banning conservative books like:

When Harry Became Sally: Responding to the Transgender Moment by Ryan Anderson, President of the Ethics and Public Policy Center, and the Founding Editor of Public Discourse, the online journal of the Witherspoon Institute of Princeton, New Jersey. He earned his Ph.D. in political philosophy from the University of Notre Dame, and his research has been cited by two U.S. Supreme Court justices in two Supreme Court cases.

Irreversible Damage: The Transgender Craze Seducing Our Daughters by Abagail Shirer which was named a "Best Book" by the Economist and the Times (of London). She holds an A.B. from Columbia College, a B.Phil. from the University of Oxford; and a J.D. from Yale Law School. Her book was pulled by Amazon and then restored after more than a year due to the number of complaints.






If we turn our attention to money matters specifically, we quickly begin to appreciate some basic issues. Money in our lives has to be a servant to the wisdom of God. In essence, if it is not then we have just allowed an opportunity for the spirit of mammon to take hold in our lives. Reliance on the wisdom of man alone potentially creates a sense of self-sufficiency and this is directly contrary to a relationship of submission to God. FAMILY TIMES OF



Visiting various parts of the country, I become more and more aware how many different perspectives there are to see God and to perceive salvation and freedom - in a sense I find myself confronted with various "religions" within the Christian community. I am also confronted by the results of these perspectives in education in young people of school-leaving age. Truth be told, these young adults make decisions based on what they had been fed in mind and soul. As such I have a deep desire in my heart to make parents aware of the critical importance of their involvement during the growing years of their children.

While on a recent trip to Gauteng I visited friends, Jannie and Tertia Putter and their two children, and great was my surprise when Jannie took me into their garden and showed me a special "place of connection" he had made

for his family. Jannie constructed a little covered wooden lapa within which he placed a black board with the family vision and prayer list surrounded by loose scatter cushions. He told me how they gather there and bond as a family and connect with God, participating early in the morning before their normal day routines start. Jannie pointed out how one of their visions of 2013 came true when they went for a ski holiday in Italy. They put their vision on the wall every year and work together as a family towards a plan for the whole year, giving them a sense of direction and belonging.

I could feel the vibrancy in their home, the connectedness, the warmth and excitement for life. I was encouraged and stirred up to share this with you as I know many other families that are desperately lonely. Unless as Christians we encourage one another to do the simple God-things and give practical guidance on how to achieve

these, many will remain in bondage of loneliness and despair.

Jannie mainly works in South African schools as a motivator for teachers and youth, and he shares some interesting facts with me:

- There are more children today with emotional problems like depression, anxiety, lack of motivation, desires to commit suicide, rebellion, sexual diseases, and addiction than ever before in history;
- In 1960 about 80% of young adults at the age of 30 was able to maintain a "adult and mature" life. Such a life implies that one is able to take care of yourself, a family and to be financially self-reliant. In the year 2000 this figure has dropped to a shocking 46% of young adults at the age of 30 years. This means that by the year 2000 about







54% of young adults were still living in their parent's homes, being financially dependent upon their parents;

- Modern life has changed at a rapid pace. We are living in an era of technology, pornography, suicides, divorce, cancer, steroids, pop-stars, social networks, television, I-pads, tablets, internet, Facebook, Whats-app and a non-stop stream of information available to anyone with a cell-phone or a computer;
- Statistics shows that the average teenager spends about 14 hours per week on a computer and about 12 hours in front of a television more than ever before (because it was not available ever before);
- More than 25% of deaths amongst youth are the result of suicide;
- One out of three children between the ages of 12 and 17 in South Africa was involved in a sexual relationship;
- A shocking amount of youth abuses alcohol and most deaths on the road are alcoholrelated;
- Alcohol is involved in most of youthsuicides:
- The amount of youth and teens struggling with emotional diseases has increased dramatically over the last decade;
- Statistics shows the probability that a youth before the age of 25 will have an emotional disease (e.g. depression, addiction, suicide-feelings) this equates to 1 out of 3 people.

God says, "He puts the lonely in the family" (Psalm 68:6). What I gather from the above statistics is that family is the place where these matters need to be addressed.

Social interaction is essential for normal social and emotional development. Socialization is a deep emotional matter; hence children who feel

needed, wanted, and depended upon at home are those who develop self-confidence and self-worth. Lack of self-worth is a reason for increased peer dependency and dependency on others things like drugs, sex, smoking and unhealthy relationships. A child's degree of self-esteem is one of the best measurements of his ability to successfully interact socially.

"This pervasive idea that children are better socialized and adjusted if they are constantly surrounded by their peers is an extravagant myth. The child who has been taught at home, who feels needed and wanted, who knows he is dependent on at home, sharing responsibilities and chores is much more likely to develop a sense of self worth and a stable value system which is the basic ingredient for positive sociability" (Dr Raymond Moore).

All we hear today is that people have no time - no time to relax, to play or pray, to reflect, to exercise, and to do what is really necessary to live a balanced life. Where is all this taking society? Where are most of us heading? What are we all chasing after?

Our children spend most of their hours in school. But what happens in schools? The facts speak so loud we cannot ignore it! Loads and loads of work, all information with little understanding and little skills; it is more a case of "keeping up with the Jones'" than actually focusing on educating children to be able to be skilled and mature leaders in society. Teachers have unfortunately lost their authority due to legislation and the common moral decay flooding every social system.

The only stable and reliable system we have today is the home as this is the place where morals and values are set in place. Every one of us has this power and ability in our hands - may we use it otherwise we will lose it! My suggestion is that families get together, even if only once a week, and pray. Let it be a good, positive connection time, a place of belonging, of safety and a time to come before the Father. We are all sons and daughters of God, through faith in Jesus (Galatians 3:26). We are not just parents, but we are also fellow believers with our children.

Some even eat the plant itself before it has had time to bare its first fruits. If this does not kill their dream, it has the effect of keeping it stunted; it appears as a bonsai, just never reaching its full potential. We need to keep from being tempted to rob our dream of the fruit that sustains its development. Some of the fruit must be reinvested to sustain growth. Give your dream the best opportunity to become what it was born to be.

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Everyone on the face of the earth has some kind of God-given gift or ability. It's the thing that you're good at naturally; the thing you enjoy doing and find satisfaction in. If you haven't found out what yours is yet, don't worry, you will sooner or later. Discovering and developing our gifts is actually not the difficult part. There are many institutions and programmes available to accommodate the progress of abilities. For example, we have schools to develop our minds, and sports programmes to develop athletic skills. However, while there are an abundance of facilities that promote developing our natural talents, there seem to be a lack of people and places that will help to develop one of the most important tools for our life-journey: CHARACTER.

Character...What is it anyway? Sometimes we fling around fancy words, only having a vague concept of its actual meaning, never really knowing the substance behind it. Character is a lot of things in one: it is your moral compass; it's your personal set of values that determine the direction of your life. Character is what remains when you pull back all the layers. Character is who you are in the dark, when no one else is there to see you. Character is the thing that the majority of your decisions hinge upon. Seems that we should pay more attention to it, knowing its importance in our lives!

Here are some of the things character is NOT: it is not always good. It is also not dependent on Christianity Some people tend to think that character is a magical endowment that one automatically receives at salvation. That couldn't be farther from the truth! Honestly, I know some non-Christians who possess more character than Christians I know. Why is that? Because it comes down to a personal decision to develop character in your life. Granted, in Christ, we have quite the advantage with the Holy Spirit by our side to help us develop our character. Nonetheless, it still comes down to a personal decision to allow that help in!

So what is the difference then between someone with good and someone with bad character? For example, let's say a person is offered a high-paying, "dream" job with a certain company. Everything seems great on the outside, but come to find out, the company uses dishonest tactics in their approach to the public. The person with bad character says, "Oh, no big deal" and finds a way to justify the dishonesty. The person with good character decides dishonesty is too high a price to pay, and turns down what others may consider the opportunity of a lifetime.

Another example: Let's say you and your friends are hanging out at school, playing rugby. One friend throws you the ball, you miss the catch, and the ball goes soaring through a window, shattering it to pieces. Of course, everyone scatters just as quickly as the glass did so as not to get caught. The person with bad character keeps on running to avoid the blame for their accidental actions. The person with good character fesses up to the innocent crime and bears the consequences.

When you are at the petrol station and the cashier gives you too much change in return, the person with bad character ignores the attendant's blunder and rejoices at the fact that they received an unauthorized discount. The person with good character returns back the overage and corrects the attendant's mistake.

I want you to note that, in each of these examples, the person with good character is making the right decision not because of someone watching them, expecting them to do so. No, actually, good character is good because it chooses to be good when no one else can see them. Good character chooses to be good when choosing bad is, in fact, the easier (and even expected) choice. It chooses to be good, not because it has to, but because it wants to do the right thing, even when it hurts!

Maybe some of you reading this have grown up with the privilege of good parents, teachers, and mentors who have helped to instil valuable moral principles and the importance of good character in your life. Possibly, there are others of you who have not had an abundance of good role models in your life. In either scenario, whether taught or not, YOU are the one with the power to allow good character to be developed in you. YOU are the one who has to make the decision. You must choose to say for yourself: "These are the things I know are right; these are the things I know are wrong. I will not compromise what is right, no matter how much it costs me." You must make the decision now to stand for what is right. If you don't stand for something, you will surely fall for anything.

As a young person, your character will be tested and tried, time and time again. As you walk through the corridor on your way to adulthood, there are plenty of doors along the way labelled "COMPROMISE". Trust me, they will seem tempting and appealing; but know for sure, once you walk through the doors of compromise, you will build unnecessary hurdles for your future. Some of those hurdles will come with some very expensive price tags. You will either pay a price now to walk in integrity and good character or you will most definitely pay a price later when dealing with the consequences of bad character. The choice is yours.

The conclusion and the point of all this talk about character is this: Your gifts and abilities, particularly in God's hands, are designed to take you somewhere in life. Jeremiah writes that God has plans to "prosper you, not to harm you; plans to give you a hope and a future" (29:11). The plans are great and if you stay committed to His plan, you will achieve the greatness He intends for you to! The Bible records that your "gift will make room for you" and it will "bring you before great men, even kings". But, my friends, the key is not just getting there - to that place of success. The key is staying there!





Worship team REHEARSAL

hether your band rehearses on a weekday evening, or on a Sunday morning a few hours before the church service, rehearsal time must be stewarded well so that your band is confident with their music and prepared to lead worship.

Rehearsals are crucial for a music band to refine their skills, develop tightness, and improve their overall performance. Here are some rehearsal tips to help your worship team make the most of your practice sessions:

- Prepare yourself: As the worship leader, you must be the most prepared member of the band. Memorize the chords and lyrics of the songs. Spend extra time practicing the parts of songs that are most difficult for you. Know what everyone else should be playing at any given time. You are the musical director of the band. Be prepared so you can hear mistakes and give them specific direction on song style and dynamics. Arrive at church 45 to 60 minutes to complete the following tasks. Turn on the sound, lighting, and video systems to ensure everything is running properly. If not, you'll have some time to troubleshoot. Next, inspect each member of the band's spot on the stage. Make sure they have all of the necessary gear like DI boxes and cables to plug into the system upon arrival. If your band uses music, make sure they have accurate copies of music arranged in order on their music stands. It also helps to include a copy of the service plan. Treat your band members like rock stars. Make sure their environment is 100% functional and reduce the amount of time it takes for them to get ready to play.
- Set clear qoals: Before each rehearsal, establish specific goals for what you want to achieve. It could be learning a new song, improving a challenging section, or working on stage presence. Having a clear objective will keep everyone focused and motivated.
- Plan the rehearsal schedule: Create a structured schedule that outlines how you'll divide your time. Allocate time for warm-up exercises, practicing individual parts, working on new material, and running through your setlist. This helps ensure a balanced rehearsal session.
- Start and end with prayer: It is important to keep the focus - while the rehearsal certainly hones musical skills, it means nothing if it isn't primarily worship! Remind the band why we are there. Sometimes the beginning of rehearsal can be stressful as you troubleshoot tech issues and other unforeseen problems. So, take a moment to pray before starting to rehearse the first song. Then, at the end, thank the Lord for the time of worship (rehearsal) and send the team home with a positive encouragement.
- Start with fundamentals: While not neccessary for every rehearsal it is good to spend time on the basics to ensure a solid foundation. Practice scales, chord progressions, rhythm exercises, or vocal exercises to strengthen individual skills and build cohesion within the band.

- Focus on difficult sections: Identify challenging sections in your songs and dedicate time to practice them separately. Slow down the tempo, break it down into smaller parts, and gradually increase the speed until everyone feels comfortable. This helps to iron out the rough spots and improve overall cohesion.
- 7. **Communication** and collaboration: Encourage open communication among band members. Everyone should feel comfortable expressing their ideas, concerns, or suggestions. Collaboration fosters creativity, strengthens the band dynamic, and leads to better performances.
- Prioritize people, not just production: Of course no worship leader or pastor would ever say it, but sometimes we value what people can contribute more than the people themselves. So you've got a killer new lead-guitar player? Do you know anything about his family, or only about his sweet pedal board? Most people love opportunities to use their gifts, but what they want more is to know that they are valued as people, and not just pawns. Take time to get to know the people on your team-either during or outside of rehearsal, and people will enjoy being there much more.
- Practice transitions: Work on smooth transitions between songs or sections. Practice cues, endings, and segues to ensure a seamless

flow in your setlist. Smooth transitions create a polished and professional performance.

- 10. Help people improve their skills: Most people get excited when they learn to do something new with a skill they enjoy. I love seeing the joy of an A/V tech learning what an until-nowmysterious knob does, a vocalist gaining some strides in singing harmony, or a pianist picking up a new rhythm. A great way to provide training is to enlist more experienced members or even outside talent to sit in with more novice members in rehearsal, allowing time for short teaching moments when they arise. If you don't have a way for your team members to improve their skills, you're missing out on much of the joy of music ministry.
- Show grace, don't just sing about it Overseeing a music ministry presents innumerable opportunities to get frustrated with people: the song slides got off, the lead guitar channel was muted during the solo, the drummer didn't end with the rest of the band, etc. While it's perfectly natural to want everything to go smoothly, it often doesn't. In these instances, we can either make people feel worse than they already do, or we can show the grace of which we so often sing about. This doesn't mean we don't care about mistakes or sloppiness, or don't try to correct repeated mistakes, but it means that we are quick to forgive, slow to get frustrated, and show others the same grace that we are shown on a daily basis. We should be concerned if we preach grace as central to the Christian life, but then present a ministry environment where little grace is actually shown. Team members that aren't afraid to fail will have more fun, and will likely perform better too.
- 12. Have fun and stay positive: Rehearsals should be enjoyable and inspiring. Maintain a positive and supportive atmosphere within the band. Celebrate achievements, provide constructive feedback, and remember to have fun together. A positive mindset leads to better creativity and productivity.

Remember that consistency is key. Regular rehearsals are essential for progress, so schedule them regularly and stick to your rehearsal routine. With dedication, teamwork, and a focused approach, your band will undoubtedly improve and thrive.

THE SONG BELONGS TO GOD

excerpt from ETERNAL WORSHIP by Waldo Malan

bout fifteen years ago I received a prophetic word from Rory Mole that went along the lines of, "I hear the words, eternal worship, I don't know what it means, but God says He will show you step-by-step the full revelation..."

Allow me to paraphrase what I understand about this term into one sentence: if the worship we offer to God impacts *eternity*, i.e., the new life after all the old things have passed away, then it will be worthy of Him. The flipside of this statement presents us with a unique challenge: if the worship we offer to God does not impact eternity, it will not be worthy of Him despite being worthy in and of the temporal things. Worship that benefits only the earthly realm will pass away like grass and whither like plucked flowers, but worship that focuses on the eternal realm will remain forever in the sight and Presence of God.

Before we can fully appreciate what 'eternal worship' entails we must understand that the God we serve is interested in relationship above all else. The most common reference in the Bible to God is that of Father; the Head of a Divine family. Everything else in our lives is to be experienced from that perspective!

Eternal worship primarily focusses on the type/kind of worship we offer God; nothing to do with style or form, but everything to do with the way we present ourselves to God. God is eternal and therefore, only things that relate to the eternal realm will matter to Him. Hence the importance for us to make sure that even our worship has something (a relevance) that will stand the test of eternity! Man tends to look on the outside and therefore we will try our utmost to present God with a show that makes use of all the pyrotechnics, lighting techniques, the best bands and sound equipment, impressive costumes and a set design that will shy for nothing. However, all of this will not be able to move God's heart one fraction in response if it does not have the one essential ingredient He always looks for: our heart. Not a physical organ, but the attitude and submission of our mind and will to the eternal purposes He has stored up for us. As soon as we offer God our worship that is birthed by His Spirit, it will come from a purified heart that is imminently acceptable to Him. In fact, this type of worship is so pleasing to Him that God labels it a new song in His Word. This type of worship is so precious to God that His Spirit will birth a unique song for every time a pure heart wills to worship: a song that has never been heard before and will forever resound in the realms inhabited by God! So, I find a parallel between eternal worship and a new song.

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You may not use this initially. You'll find other ways to understand key signatures, chord progressions, and other tricks to keep you on track. But later, once you have a firm grasp on everything involved there is no better organized way to sort it all out in your head on the fly than this.

The Basic Building Blocks of the Circle of Fifths


The first pattern is the KEY. The Circle of Fifths only deal with perfect fifths going clockwise around the circle. You'll never use the whole circle in one song, just a section of it.

The most popular chord progression in the world, in which most pop music recycles over and over is the: I-IV-V-I. Roman numerals are used in music theory to indicate notes in a scale and also the chords in any key. There are both major chords and minor chords; in a MAJOR KEY we find MAJOR CHORDS on the tonic, the fourth, and the fifth. Interstingly, if you find the tonic of your key on the Circle, you've already found the 4th chord and the 5th chord in the key and can construct a catchy song in less than 10 seconds.

Find the tonic (first note) of your key, if you move one step clockwise, you find the 5th chord, and if you move one step counter-clockwise, you've found the 4th chord.

You'll also notice if you take one more step out in either direction you find the 2nd and 7th Chords. This half of your circle expands your chord choices in creating progressions.

Every major key has a relative minor key. What this means is that both keys use the exact same notes, including any accidentals (sharps or flats).


Transposing Songs on the Fly Using the Circle

A common use for transposition is when a song is a bit out of range for a vocalist. It's very similar to modulation, to the point where people get confused and used the words interchangeably.

All that you need to do is find the tonic of the key you want to use (usually one or two steps above or below the current key) and you can snag the chords right off of the circle. This is just like with the chord progression above. If you know the song is a I – IV – V – I, then all you have to do is find your new key, and the tonic is I, one step left is the IV, and one step right is the V.

Whether you need chord progressions, to transpose a song, help transcribing music, or remember which keys have which accidentals, the Circle of Fifths is the catchall tool to get the job done. All it takes is practice.

hen we look at worship, many of us see it as something we are to do once a week. For others it has become a daily part of our lives. When we look at the element of praise, the Bible is very clear on when and how we are to praise God. It is a very simple directive for the believer:

Psalm 34:1 says, "I will extol the Lord at all times; his praise will always be on my lips."

Psalms 103:1 says, "Praise the Lord, 0 my soul; all my inmost being, praise his holy name".

"All my inmost being". God doesn't want a flippant offering of praise as we are walking into the church or as it crosses our minds. He wants everything that is in us to praise His name. He desires wholehearted praise from deep

with us that is not inhibited by others. Too often we offer up praise that is not from our hearts. We voice it as if we were talking to a friend on the phone. Praise is a serious thing to God. Heaven is filled with it. He says that He is enthroned in the midst of it. Psalm 22:3 He even named the tribe to which Jesus would come out of "Judah" which means "praise".

And lastly, we are to do it with joy. Psalm 9:2 says, "I will be glad and rejoice in you; I will sing praise to your name, 0 Most High". Psalm 33:1 states, "Sing joyfully to the LORD, you righteous; it is fitting for the upright to praise him".


How is this possible? You mean when I praise, I have to do it all the time, with all that I am, and joyfully as well? That's a tall order to say the least. We have to remember, this is a God thing. When we accepted Jesus as Lord and Savior it was a serious decision. It can be compared to living in a place where Kings rule. We are to be totally loyal to the king. 


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
