
















am sitting outside enjoying a beautiful Florida evening as only those who have been there can witness.





## MOVING MOUNTAINS

#### **The Preparation**

"And Jesus, replying, said to them, 'Have faith in God (constantly). Truly I tell you, whoever says to this mountain, Be lifted up and thrown into the sea! And does not doubt at all in his heart but believes that what he says will take place, it will be done for him. For this reasonIng I am telling you, whatever you ask for in prayer, believe (trust and be confident) that it is granted to you, and you will (get it)" (Mark 11:22-24 AMP).

here are three simple steps to blast and remove the mountains in our lives that seem to loom over us and stand in the way of us receiving the reality of God's promises. However, in order to do this, we need to recognize that the words recorded in the gospel of Mark are foundational to the life of faith. In fact, this type of mountain-moving or mountain-blasting faith is exactly what Jesus operated in when He walked on earth. These were the type of results He got when He prayed and believed and spoke God's will. We know that the Bible teaches us to imitate Jesus and have Him as our example and so most believers take this portion of scripture and begin shouting and declaring scripture at the "mountains" in their lives, expecting to see results like Jesus did, yet they seldom get the results they desire. Why is that? Well, I believe that the reason is simply because no matter how foundational they may be, these verses are not stand-alone.

And so to begin with our first step of blasting and removing our mountains, we must begin with a certain amount of preparation. That's right, we need to do a little homework concerning our mountains before we just throw our explosive words of scripture at them. We may end up causing more damage than what's worth, without even denting our mountain! So to do our preparation means to become a little more informed about our mountain and most certainly what caused it to be there in the first place. Truth is some of us may have more than just one mountain standing in the way of our miracle, we may find ourselves staring in the face of an entire mountain range that has been built up over years. We need to get wisdom concerning our mountain, godly wisdom that reveals the root cause of it's threatening existence.

The teaching of Jesus on moving mountains is foundational to our faith but they don't stand in isolation! Just like the rest of the Bible, these verses need to be read in context in order to understand them fully. The preceding section (v.11-17) states:

Then Jesus entered Jerusalem and went to the temple. And after looking around at everything, he went out to Bethany with the twelve since it was already late. Now the next day, as they went out from Bethany, he was hungry. After noticing in the distance a fig tree with leaves, he went to see if he could find any fruit on it. When he came to it he found nothing but leaves, for it was not the season for figs. He said to it, "May no one ever eat fruit from you again." And his disciples heard it. Then they came to Jerusalem. Jesus entered the temple area and began to drive out those who were selling and buying in the temple courts. He turned over the tables of the money

changers and the chairs of those selling doves, and he would not permit anyone to carry merchandise through the temple courts. Then he began to teach them and said, "Is it not written: 'My house will be called a house of prayer for all nations'? But you have turned it into a den of robbers!"

Notice that Jesus didn't say anything to the fig tree or the money changers in the temple the first day He went there. The Bible said that He made the trip, saw what was going on and walked away. It's obvious that He was angered and even outraged by what He saw, yet instead of reacting to it, He looked around, walked out and returned to Bethany. Why? Because Jesus said that He only did what He saw His Father do and that He only said what He heard His Father say. So obviously, He needed to first hear His Father on the matter before He reacted. He needed time to pray and speak to His Father concerning what was troubling Him. So He went back to Bethany to spend the night getting direction and wisdom from His Father about the situation.

Now if Jesus had to receive wisdom and direction before He acted, then surly we do too, especially before confronting our mountains.

Before confronting our mountain, we are to seek Godly wisdom too, from the Word of God. Proverbs 4:7 says, "The beginning of wisdom is: get wisdom (skillful and godly wisdom)! For it is the principle thing. And get understanding (discernment, comprehension and interpretation)"; "...skillful and godly wisdom (which is the comprehensive insight into the ways and purposes of God" (v.11).

Only when Jesus knew what His Father wanted Him to do, He went back to the temple to operate in faith and clean house. Just the same, we can't just jump up and start commanding mountains to move before we do a little preparation work.

The reason for this is that all mountains are not the same and each mountain has a root! Very often we have an entire mountain range that has been built up over a number of years through fear, unbelief and disobedience to God's word. It could be a mountain of financial debt or sickness or depression or heartache concerning our rebellious children or a rocky marriage. Each of these things must be dealt with individually. If you are determined to deal with the mountain so that it doesn't rise up again, you need to find out what caused it.

So, like Jesus did, pray for wisdom. James 1:5 say that we can ask God for wisdom, "...liberally without reproach". We can seek God's council from His word concerning our situation, repent where we have neglected to walk in wisdom and begin to walk in obedience to His word.

#### **The Mountain of Financial Debt**

If you are facing a mountain of financial debt, recognize that according to God's wisdom, we are to owe no man anything but to love him. (Romans 13:8). Begin to do away with those credit cards 6 and unnecessary loans. Be faithful to tithe and bring your financial



offerings to the Lord. Repent of squanders living and begin to walk in wisdom concerning the day-to-day management of your finances. We have found that many people are in the financial difficulty they are in because they have never recorded their monthly income and expenses or put a simple monthly budget together. Without a definite plan to tackle debt and live within your means, your mountain is going nowhere but up in size, no matter how many scriptures you hurl at it.

#### The Mountain of Sickness and Depression

Sometimes we are faced with the dark mountain of sickness or depression that threatens to terrify our souls and drain the joy of the Lord right out of us. The Word teaches us to be extremely diligent where the area of our thoughts are concerned. No matter how negative and depressing your thought life can appear, put wisdom to practice - recognize which thoughts are based on fear and doubt, take them captive and cast them right out of your mind. Then be sure to replace each one with the truth of God's word that brings life and peace. This process of bringing our thoughts into submission to God's word is called renewing your mind. Romans 12:2 says that renewing our minds to God's word is His perfect will for our lives! When God's word shouts louder inside of us than the depressing thoughts of defeat, we begin to see a turn in the tide and victory becomes a sure thing. However, neglecting to deal with the negative thoughts that harass our minds will ensure your defeat.

#### The Mountain of Rebellious Children

Perhaps your mountain is the painful reminder of your rebellious children. From experience, I have found that parenting is not for the feint hearted, no matter the age or gender of the child. However the Holy Spirit is constantly available to us as our teacher and comforter. The word of God is very clear on the responsibility of a parent to raise our children in the way of the Lord, consistently training and disciplining in love and living by example. When we decide to model lives of love, honesty and self-control in front of our children, they follow suit. Keep a tight reign on strife and mean-spiritedness, and give no room for I'll talking or disrespect. Preaching to your children will only bring frustration and indifference. Rather preach by your own right living, patience and kindness. Always disciplining in love and remain consistent to avoid confusion and distrust.

Children always mimic their parents' natures, so take a good long look in the mirror before shouting your scriptures and allow the Holy Spirit to correct some  $\ _{7}$  corrective, internal surgery before you try move this mountain.

#### The Mountain of a Rocky Marriage

Facing the mountain of a rocky marriage can be so disheartening. Wouldn't it be wonderful if all we needed to do to see change or improvement was to quote a few scriptures, stand back and see the transformation take place before our eyes?! Oh boy, that would be great! And if this is your impression, you have been misinformed for sure. I came to realize that a marriage consists of two people - my spouse and me. Only the Holy Spirit has the ability to change the heart of our spouse so our responsibility lies entirely with our own walk of love and gentle attitude and quietly praying for them. Learning how to unconditionally love someone you live with, takes much diligence and self-surrender to the Spirit of God.

The Bible teaches us to strive to walk in love and forgiveness continuously. We are told to consistently seek out our partner's best interest and always be prepared to embrace change within godly boundaries. Very often we have to start focusing on the good things we have in our marriage, being grateful for them, instead of always making issues of the ones we can't change without divine intervention. By no means does this mean we should settle for unhappiness. On the contrary, while you stand on the promises of God's word concerning your marriage, be diligent to walk in love and patience, always considering your spouse before your own needs. This kind of godly conduct is conducive to harmony and peace and cultivates an environment for understanding.

#### **Don't Just Shout!**

The word of God is most powerful and when used with wisdom and understanding, will always bring life changing results. However, shouting scripture at your mountain won't cause it to move an inch let alone cause it to disappear into the sea. In order to get the results Jesus got when he exercised His faith and spoke God's word, we need to do a little preparation first. Getting God's perspective and wisdom concerning our problem or mountain is the first step to seeing it uprooted and thrown right out of our lives for good.

ave you ever decided to stay in a bad situation simply because you were afraid to move?

I can remember my knees feeling so weak when God was trying to take me to a new level in my ministry. In fact, it was very tempting to stay where I was at the time because I was comfortable. But somehow I knew that if I gave in to my fear, I would regret it.

Too often, we decide to wait for our fears to subside before we will do what God is asking us to do. Unfortunately, our fears may never subside—so instead of waiting, we need to learn how to be courageous.

My husband, Dave, defines courage as the willingness to risk who you are and what you have for what you want and who you want to be. It's a definition that has helped me face my fears to become the person I am today.

Whatever difficulties you're facing right now, "I will not fear," is the attitude you need to embrace. I want you to understand that you've got what it takes to make it through every challenge that comes your way.

It Is What It Is, So Don't Worry

God gave me a test recently, and it was a pretty major one. My doctors thought they'd found something in me that would have been a serious health problem, and even though I was going through a stressful time, I knew God wanted me to keep quiet about it. So here I am, waiting for test results, doing mental gymnastics for about two weeks. And I just kept saying to myself, "It is what it is. requests), with thanksgiving, continue to make your wants known to God."


Sometimes you have to press in to an attitude of praise and thanksgiving. And it takes a lot of faith and patience, but you can trust that God has your future in His hands.

## VISION FOR THE NATION

o many people ask if it is wise to have more children when living in South Africa. It seems that the latest trend among young people is to be sterilised even before they get married, and this is attributed to their fear of the unknown. This trend is a clear indication that many people have totally lost hope for themselves, their children and the next generation. In fact, they don't actually think about a next generation as their short-sighted perspective inhibits them to ponder so far.

Recently two factors renewed my excitement about the future for our nation, and I find myself unable to stop sharing these. A short while back I presented some seminars in Phalaborwa, where my main aim was to assist and encourage families in their educational journey. During one of these presentations I asked a quiet, young man - a farmer from the district - what he had learnt from attending the seminars. His answer to me was, "I do not only understand what my children's future will look like, I also understand that I have the ability to also know what my grandchildren's future will look like." In a short presentation of "hope-talk" and visionary influence, a young father could see into a next generation. He realised that his influence in his own children's life can even effect a next generation, that of his grandchildren. This father instantly understood his responsibility to his offspring as well as their children. I was reminded of the saying that "spearheading multiplication is not the only task expected of Christian leaders", and, in the words of M. Rush, that "there is no greater leadership challenge than the challenge to help our followers become leaders capable of training their followers to be leaders also." (Rush, New Leader)

Then the next incident to pique my interest was when I noticed a man sitting in the front row during the seminar, not saying a word. He looked very sceptical and resistant to be at this meeting of parents who are interested in the education and future of their children. During break time this man asked to make a booking for a consultation and said, "I need help beacuse I have never been empowered by anybody to be a proper dad." He went home after the seminar and the next day taught his son (now 11) to use a welding machine, which was a first-time experience for both of them since his son was born. He realised for the first time in his life that he had all inside of himself that was necessary to empower his own son for the future. It was also during the consultation that this father 'heard' that "through the Holy Spirit, he was furnished with the multi-faceted and inexhaustible divine adequacy which he needed to pursue his calling as a dad according to the will of God." This life-sharing situation, equipment and training was the beginning of new hope for this family.

You might ask how I can be excited about these simple matters, as it is so unpretentious. It is precicely because of its simplicity that it becomes clear these situations are in the plan of God. For the parties directly affected by this Divine encounter (bacause that is what it really is), it easy to follow as this was exactly the life that Jesus has modelled for us. Scripture and Church history are full of examples of God calling the unqualified, and qualifying them through a process that speaks of His patience, grace and

Fatherly love. Jesus modelled an example where real life, with all its complexities, is the workshop for the "making of people". This direct involvement of a parent serves to increase motivation and promote a sense of responsibility and ownership. Gunter Krallman states that the model Jesus left for us was one of focusing on learning through doing, or being actively involved (Following Jesus, 1987).

Many of us have an "orphan spirit" and therefore do not have the capacity to lead others, especially our own children, into an understanding of the love of the Father. When we know God our Father adopted us because of His love and grace and not because of anything we did to deserve it (Romans 5:8) we will find our security in who He is, and not in what we do. This is truly amazing grace, and precicely the grace that needs to be extended to a next generation.

Our fear starts as we listen to the people around us - politicians, teachers, spiritual leaders, community leaders - talk about the future, our children, the state of education, crime, declining moral standards and the economy. Have we ever stopped to consider the economy of God? And God's blueprint for education, where He intended education as a mentoring lifestyle within the family, where character formation was the focus? Family relationships are intense and dramatic with permanent transformations taking place. This was God's great aim with the family as His institution.

We must come back to the basics, where parents take the responsibility for their children and providing a safe place to grow in the family. Parents must reclaim their role as prime educators, where they exert influence through an avenue of relationship. We need parents making intentional time for sharing the ways of God to their children and training them how to apply these. Children who have a firm Godly worldview will in future influence the lives of thousands upon thousands of people.

On my arrival back from Phalaborwa I was greeted with the wonderful news that my daughter is pregnant with her fourth child. She is 26 and my other grandchildren are respectively 4, 2 and 1 years of age. The news of her pregnancy gave me a burning motivation to be more active in the answer for our nation. What hope do we have for a next generation of people if we are not willing to be changing agents in this generation? "One of the Master's leading intentions in the coaching of his friends was that they would in the future remember and reproduce what they had learned through their association with Him" (C.C. Manz and H.P. Sims, Company of Heroes: Unleashing the Power of Self-Leadership).

I bought a big map of South Africa and I jotted down on it the amazing faithful families in the country that have hope for their families – hope for education and hope for the nation. It is not a dead hope in nothing but rather an active participation in life-giving and growth towards people with Godly character that can make a difference in the future. Jesus was totally obedient to God and had a deep concern for the character development of His disciples. These that have hope are trusting God for children with good character.

The perspective I have as a person travelling the nation is not that parents are passive, but that parents have seen the light, that they have a passion for the next generation, and that they also are passionately involved in raising their own children and be supportive of other families and their

children. It is not true that we are a desperate country and that there is no hope! There is a harvest coming from the seeds have been sown for over 20 years. It is a harvest made possible through home educating families, where the home-grown children have become adults with Godly influence. They now are starting to home educate their own children and witness a new generation of leaders that are walking our streets, entering the business world and influencing communities. It is a people that are willing to lay down themselves.

If there are readers without hope, make sure you get the correct inspiration from those who have hope in God and a strong conviction in their roles in the upbringing of their children as well as a dedication to be life givers. This role is not a role of exercising of power but as of empowering others.

Christian schools are a great help but unless the parents are also empowered to be the first educators, with the schools as the extension of the parents, it will still leave the parents powerless.

**Dynamis/Uncapped Education** empowers parents to take up their unique roles as God intended with the the dads being the visionaries (spiritual leaders) of their house hold. The fullness of this influence in essence is not in what the parents say but who they are.



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
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## HOW CREATIVE PEOPLE CAN SURVIVE TOUGH FINANCIAL TIMES

YOUR MEDIA AND ENTERTAINMENT CAREER IS A MARATHON, NOT A SPRINT.

recently spoke to a group of Hollywood entertainment professionals and shared some tips for getting through tough financial times. Although it's difficult, it's essential that, whenever possible, we do our best not to let financial challenges distract us from our career or calling. My talk was geared toward entertainment and media people, but it would work for anyone in almost any situation. Let me know if these suggestions could help you, and please share them with someone experiencing this type of financial or job crisis:

- 1) First, don't overreact. Too many people panic during times like this and make decisions they regret later. Don't assume the worst, and don't be afraid. Should we plan? Yes. Is this serious? Yes. But it's not time to freak out.
- 2) Streamline your life. What are "convenience" areas? Could you downsize your car? Take in a roommate? Cut back on any luxuries? How about too many lattes? One Starbucks trip a day is more than \$100+ a month. Don't hack, but start looking at areas that don't really reflect your mission or calling or aren't making a positive difference.
- **3) Don't cut your lifelines.** God is your source not your bank account. And your friends and relationships are what feed your spirit. Research shows that it's friendships that get people through difficult times. So reconnect today.

- **4) Re-think your Focus.** After a few years in the business, too many industry people forget their original goal. That's usually because they don't keep their eyes on the target. Things change, but it never hurts to remember your priorities. Either you live your life by priorities or by pressures. Never lose sight of that during challenging times. It will help keep you focused. This might be God's wake-up call to remind you of your original vision and purpose. Take this time to re-think and re-evaluate.
- **5) Keep Growing.** Are you engaging in the current culture? I've met some industry people trapped in the 70's or 80's. Don't chase trends; study them to see where the culture is going. There's an old advertising saying: "Once product sales are down, it's too late to advertise." Telling your story should be an ongoing process and you should always be looking for original and innovative ways to engage with other professionals. If you're telling the same stories or pitching the exact projects you did 2-3 years ago, then you're behind the curve. Far too many filmmakers are answering questions nobody's asking. (Pastors, are you listening?)

My friend and film producer Ralph Winter said something profound – "Success in Hollywood or the media is a marathon, not a sprint." Accurate expectations can make a significant difference in your potential for success. Realize that "overnight" success stories often take 10-20 years to unfold. Plan for the long haul. Otherwise, you'll give up too soon and never have the chance to reach your potential.

## TEN CRITICAL KEYS FOR DESIGNING A CREATIVE CUITURF

#### AN INCREDIBLY IMPORTANT TASK DURING THIS CULTURAL MOMENT...

t's no secret that culture is more important than vision. I've worked in creative, vibrant cultures where original thinking is valued, people listen to each other, and wonderful things happen. On the other hand I've worked at organizations where you could literally feel the oppression when you walked into the building. Those destructive cultures often have leaders with great vision and potential, but because the culture is so negative, that vision will never be realized.

And right now, during this time of turmoil around the world, creativity will be vital in providing a roadmap out. So there's no better time to develop a creative culture inside your organization.

So how to do you build a creative culture? In my book Ideas on a Deadline: How to Be Creative When the Clock is Ticking, I describe 10 principles I've used to turn around numerous organizations:

- 1. Create Stability Creative people need stability. If they're worried about losing their job, financial problems, or excessive turnover, they'll never release their best ideas. I've seen terrible leaders think they're motivating the team by threatening them with being fired which is the worst thing you could ever do. Even when you're going through difficult times, create an atmosphere of stability for the team. You'll be rewarded down the road.
- 2. Make it Safe from Excessive Criticism Critics are a dime a dozen, but leaders who can help their team move from bad ideas to legendary ideas are rare. There's a time to look at what doesn't work, but that should be done in an atmosphere of trust. Criticism always goes down better when it comes from a trusted and respected source.
- 3. Make Sure Your Leaders Are On the Same Page All it takes is one of your leaders to contradict what you're trying to do to wreck a creative culture. At the beginning of building your culture, make

absolutely sure your leadership team is unified and moving with you. One critical or disconnected leader or manager can sow seeds of doubt that will topple the entire project.

- **4. Be Flexible** Creative people don't all operate on the same schedule or work the same way. Give your team some flexibility and it will revolutionize their attitude. At one major nonprofit I talked the CEO into allowing the creative team to rip up carpet, repaint, dump the cubicles, and design their own work spaces. There was fear and trembling on the CEO's part, but within a matter of months, the creative team transformed that organization.
- **5. Get Them The Tools They Need** Nothing drags a creative team down as much as broken, old, or out-of-date tools. Sure we all have budget challenges, but do whatever you can to get them the right computers, design tools, video equipment and whatever else they need. Think about it: The less time and energy they spend overcoming technical and equipment problems, the more time and energy they can spend on developing amazing ideas.
- **6. Push Them Outside Their Comfort Zone** Leaders often think that creative people want to be left alone and operate on their own schedule. Sure they like to create their own timetable, but they also relish a challenge. In fact, while they probably won't admit it, creative people love deadlines because it gives them perspective on the project. I don't even like to start working until I can see the deadline approaching. There is just something about a challenge that gets my blood flowing and the ideas
- **7. Get Out Of Their Way** One of the most important aspects of a creative culture, once it's in process, is to get out of the way of your creative team. We all know micro-managing is a disaster for anyone especially creatives. So give them space

and let them solve problems on their own.

- 8. Understand the Difference Between Organizational Structure and Communication Structure This is a huge issue for me. Every organization needs an organizational structure. Who reports to who matters, and hierarchy is important. But when it comes to communication, I recommend you throw the organizational structure out the window. Your creative team should be able to call anyone to ask questions and discuss ideas. Don't force them to communicate through supervisors, managers, or anyone else. Create a free-flowing communications system, and the ideas will grow.
- 9. Walk The Factory Floor Leadership expert John Maxwell recommends that leaders "walk the factory floor" and meet every employee. Develop a personal relationship with employees at all levels especially when it comes to your creative team. Pixar and Disney Animation President Ed Catmull takes that seriously even when it comes to giving bonuses. When they produce a box-office success, they share the profits with the team that produced it which often numbers more than 100 people. But Ed doesn't just mail or direct deposit the check and send a nice note. Ed takes the time to either go to each team member personally or invite them to his office individually and hand them the check and tell them how much their work is appreciated.
- **10. Give Them Credit** Finally, a great creative culture allows everyone to be noticed for their accomplishments. Never take credit for your team's work, and always give them the honor they're due. You'll find that when you protect your creative team and allow them to get the glory for their work, they'll follow you into a fire.



n places all around the world, the Salvation Army hosts Christmas Dinners for the needy and the homeless. Many of you may have participated in large dinners of this kind. These are the kinds of dinners and feasts Jesus is suggesting in the Book of Luke:

"Then the master of the house . . . said to his servant, 'Go out quickly into the streets and lanes of the city, and bring in here the poor, and the maimed, and the lame, and the blind.' And the servant said, 'Master, it is done as you commanded, and still there is room.' Then the master said to the servant, 'Go out into the highways and hedges, and compel them to come in, that my house may be filled'."

Luke 14:21-23

Let me tell you just one story from one Salvation Army dinner: The room was large, so the tables were set with over one hundred place settings. Decorations were somewhat sparse, but an attempt had been made to set a festive tone. The red plastic cups on the tables filled the room with a cheerful thread of colour. The sound of carols was growing louder as the band tuned up, and the aromas of roasting meat and mince pie had begun filling the room.

Scores of eager volunteers were looking at their watches and waiting for the doors to open. When the doors were finally opened, Elizabeth, a volunteer hostess, was waiting to greet the fifth guest at the door. A woman with dark bruises on her face entered. She held a baby in her arms and the hand of a three-year old boy. Closely following her was a young girl looking about with frightened eyes. Elizabeth welcomed them and escorted them to a place at one of the tables. Throughout the following three hours, Elizabeth seated many other guests, but she frequently returned to talk a moment with the small family awhile and to make certain their needs were being met.

The dinner included music, singing and gifts as well as a Bible Story about our loving Heavenly Father, and how He had provided this meal because He loved every person there.

In the afternoon as people were leaving, the tiny girl came running back to where Elizabeth was clearing a table. She spoke rapidly, "God never invited me to a pretty dinner before. I wanted to thank Him, but I didn't see Him, so please tell Him for me." Then she darted out the door and was gone.

That story is hard to tell without my handkerchief being handy. And it gives pause to wonder when I last invited a stranger to my table for a dinner that God was hosting. Reminding me once again that: The seed I sow is the only

seed that will grow.

Those Words of Jesus are surely a clarion call to each of us to include in our festivities those who don't have the means to return our hospitality. It is not our hospitality; anyway, it is God's. God has provided our homes and places of dwelling. God has given us food for our tables. And in case we have forgotten, it is to be a feast in God's Name. God will even provide the guests or recall those He wants us to compel to come in. Sometimes I feel that I need to thank Him for just for letting me participate.

Recently, I was told of someone who writes a daily thank you letter to God during this season. Sort of a visual "attitude of gratitude." At first thought that seems sort of odd, and who has time? But if you ponder the idea, you'll be reminded that during this season, there are so many special things that fill our days. So many in fact that a few weeks later we can't even remember them all. Think of the blessings of all the extra hospitality, and the many small-unexpected gifts a cup of coffee brought to your desk; your daughter's excitement about playing the part of Mary, in the church pageant; a basket of fruit left on your doorstep; a much-needed Bible verse dropped into your thoughts by the Holy Spirit just at the right moment; and of course, there are extra hugs, and miles-of-smiles.

Anyway, the idea told to me was that the thank you notes should be in the form of a daily letter to our loving Heavenly Father. Then seal them, drop them in a box and put the box away for another season. Because many of us will need them about January or so. There will come a dark day (be it physical or spiritual) when we need to get out our box, open the letters and rejoice all over again in the many wonderful expressions of the JOY of the Lord.

When God sent an angel to announce Jesus' arrival on earth, the angel said, "I bring you good tidings of great joy . . . And the shepherds made known abroad the saying." Luke 2:10-17 So, let's also make known abroad the Joy by lifting up the Name of Jesus in all of our festivities, and especially during this season we call Christmas.

The season gets its name from the Catholic Church Liturgy, meaning, a Christ-Mass. In Latin, the farewell phrase of the communion service is "missa est" (which became known as "Mass") or "Go forth." Thus, the intent of a "Christmass," celebration, is to "go forth" lifting up the Name of our Lord Jesus, Who is the Christ, the Messiah.

If our feasts and festivities are hollow and disappointing, it's because we have left out the reason for JOY. Joy comes when we live Life In Fullness Everyday by joining with God to give His LIFE away!

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# SUNG WORSHIP: DIVERSITY OF

## **THEOLOGICAL**

#### **OUR COMMON GROUND**

Whenever people of the Christian faith gather together to worship, there's music. Pretty much no matter what denomination, flavor, styles, age, ethnicity, culture or location around the globe, it would seem that all Believers agree that we want to worship God through songs.

But while we might share that commonality, there is actually quite a diverse range of objectives - or emphases - for that music, and very different concepts of what ought to be achieved in the room in order for the worship of God to have occurred.

This diversity of emphases for sung worship within the Christian Church is a topic I have thought and prayed about - and wrestled with - over many years. In fact, my experiences in this regard have, in part, inspired the curriculum for More Than Music Mentor. More Than Music Mentor is the name I use for the online and onsite training I offer to the Christian Church globally - the singers, instrumentalists, and technicians especially.

Through More Than Music Mentor, I try to bring clarity and unity while celebrating our rich diversity within the Christian Church as we worship - or show the worth - of God through songs.

Now, I suspect that most church-attending Believers don't think about this too much. They would happily and inadvertently adopt the emphases their particular church culture places on sung worship. Perhaps their own, preferred style and emphases are a reflection of beliefs, experiences, how they were raised or maybe even as a reaction to how they were raised. In any case, most people have a style of worshipping God through songs where they feel most comfortable.

To me, this is not a problem. People are different from one another. God created us to be. This diversity, I would say, is down to stylistic preferences and peripheral theological values.

#### THE WIDENING SCHISM

But there are those who see these differences as being due to more than stylistic preferences and peripheral theology. Some will confidently declare a different approach from their own as "Not *real* worship" or words to that effect. Others, I'm sure, will simply hold that view internally or perhaps elude to their position in veiled terms rather than speak it out so clearly.

Want to see this for yourself? Just jump on any of the "worship" Facebook groups and look at some of the more contentious posts, comments, and conversations. You won't have to dig too deep.

Perhaps I hear more of this because of my work as More Than Music Mentor. But in my experience, it's becoming more common for individuals or groups to think that *their* values - what *they're* shooting for - with sung worship, is (or should be) the same for everyone. That *their* sung worship is superior in some way to others.

But I don't agree. Yes, we all want God to be worshipped, but surely music can be used in many different ways to worship Him. We worship a BIG God! I'm sure He can handle it. Thank God we're not all the same!

#### DIVERSE EMPHASES

Being a visual thinker (like a lot of people), I made myself a graph to help me understand this diversity. Since I travel a lot to serve churches of all different styles, flavors, denominations and theological emphases, the graph has helped

me have a better understanding of any preexisting culture that I might be stepping into.

It's my goal to have sincere respect for that existing culture - no matter what it is - in order to serve as best I can. Understanding the graph helps me to "read the room" better, especially when I am asked to lead sung worship for a combined church - or ecumenical - event which often has a diverse range of people in attendance.

This graph - and the explanation that accompanies it - seems to be helping people get a clearer picture of what we're trying to do when we lead sung worship. It also seems to be helping individuals develop a respect and appreciation for others who might view sung worship somewhat differently from themselves. This, in turn, can help us better understand how to serve our *whole* congregation. To celebrate diversity rather than bringing unintentional division. To help the church be more as one as Jesus prayed that we would be!

"I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me."



So, over my next several articles, I want to share the graph with you!

This might look a little scientific at first glance, but I think you'll find that, if you take a good look and read my explanations, it should become pretty simple. So, here's my 3D "XYZ" graph SUNG WORSHIP: OUR DIVERSITY OF EMPHASES. In this article, I'll only label and describe one of the three axis points. The labels for the other two will be revealed in future articles:

#### WHAT IS THE GRAPH NOT SHOWING?

Firstly, let me say that this is *not* supposed to be a definitive, entirely accurate way to categorize people, groups of people, churches, or denominations. Please receive this in very general terms and as the helpful tool I intend it to be.

It's worth noting that one congregation can include people whose emphases are placed very differently from most other members of the congregation, or perhaps even the church's leaders. This can happen as individuals, families or a circle of friends switch church affiliation. Or as churches change in their emphases leaving some of the existing congregation feeling like their preferred emphases are no longer being catered for as they once were.

Does the phrase, "We'd better have at least one old hymn," sound familiar?

And please keep in mind that peoples' emphases can change. I know mine certainly have over the years! My hope is that we can at least recognize and appreciate the emphases

of other worshippers even if they are somewhat different from our own.

#### WHAT IS THE GRAPH SHOWING?

From what I've observed, people who participate in sung worship generally have some preferences, biases, or emphases that they favor over others. They have particular goals or values when it comes to sung worship. No matter how strong these values may be, they influence their expectations or hopes for sung worship. This graph is my best attempt to show those differences visually.

Each Individual worshiper can be plotted somewhere on this three-dimensional graph. And since groups of people who agree with one another on these sorts of issues tend to flock together, it's also true that each church congregation would tend to have a region or "blob" on this graph. The same could be said of each denomination. The position on the graph could be as a result of many different things but would certainly include theology (understanding of God), Biblical interpretation, experiences and the established culture or musical worship.

First, let's look at

#### THE RED "X" AXIS: THEOLOGICAL VS EXPERIENTIAL

Some Christians have music in their gatherings primarily to teach and remind their congregations of correct theology. God's truth. As they sing, the goal is that they would come to know God more deeply. Understand The Gospel more completely. As they sing, their reverence and awe for God should increase. I call this segment of the Christian Church the "sing correct theology" team.

The song lyrics for the "sing correct theology" team tend to have a lot of words. Often intense, rich, poetry that digs deeply into Christian doctrine. While congregants may be deeply moved internally, they might not show it on the outside. They will tend to remain fully cognizant - mindful, reverent - as they sing.

Repeating a section of a song too often, or extended periods of instrumental music can easily unsettle the theological emphasis worshippers.

But on the other end of the "X" axis, we find

people who have music in their gatherings primarily to help facilitate experiences of God's manifest presence. Indeed, the "worship leader" is often described as having the task of ushering the congregation into God's presence - or of inviting God's presence to be with us - so we can meet with Him in a more intimate way.

The music from the platform should help create an atmosphere where people are more open to the things of God - especially the miraculous, supernatural things of God. I call this segment of the Christian Church the "sing it till you feel it" team.

Songs for the "sing it till you feel it" team tend to have fewer lyrics. More repeats. Simpler poetry. Repeating a bridge or chorus - even many times - is wonderful for the "sing it till you feel it" team. Periods of subtle, atmospheric musical textures, even without any singing (and sometimes just in total silence) are often used. Drawn out dynamic builds leading to powerful anthemic refrains can enhance this experiential approach.

The members of this team don't want to have to read a lot of words on a screen nor intellectually process deeper meaning from the song's lyrics. They'd prefer to close their eyes, be able to sing from memory or even sing or pray freely as they experience a deepening sense of God's presence.

At the experiential end of this axis, we may use song lyrics that invite God to manifest His presence amongst us. We may ask - even implore - God to allow us to receive more of His Holy Spirit in the here and now.

But on the opposite, theological side, worshippers would have a strong sense that God is omnipresent and that He has already completely and utterly given Himself to us. All of creation. His son Jesus. His Holy Spirit. The scriptures. Nothing more is required. To these worshippers, it might seem ungrateful and inappropriate to ask God for more.

#### CONCLUSION

But let me be clear: This red "X" axis is a continuum. The extreme ends will be very different, but most of us are somewhere closer to the center. Experiential people can also want good theology. Theology people can have experiences of God's presence too!

But some people are just kind of more "touchy feely". Others are more cerebral and "bookish". Know what I mean? It's okay to be different. That's how we were made. God loves us all. This side of eternity, nobody's worship is pure and perfect yet. Only God gets to judge that anyway.
